Be daring. Be brave. Have fun!





Financial Need







SELECTION PROCESS

In 200 words or less, please write a short paragraph describing your school and choral program. Include anything interesting or unique about your area, program, or your students. This narrative will be submitted to the committee for consideration, so anonymity is essential. The intent of this festival is to showcase outstanding choral ensembles that represent the diversity of our great state.

FESTIVAL PERFORMANCE ADJUDICATION

Each ensemble participating in the California State Choir Festival will receive recorded comments from a panel of three prominent clinicians and receive a clinic with one of the clinicians immediately following the performance. You must provide three original scores for each piece your ensemble will perform.

PARTICIPANT FEE

The festival participation fee is \$450. The application and recordings are due Sept. 15, 2025. The participant fee is due immediately upon notification of acceptance but no later than November 30, 2025. All accepted schools will be invoiced with options for paying by credit card or check.

After December 1, 2025 refunds will only be given if the event is canceled due to State or local travel restrictions.

FUTURE YEARS FESTIVALS

We plan to return to Southern California in Spring 2027 and continue this pattern into the future.

PREREQUISITES

Participating groups must have received a Superior rating or have participated in a Comments Only CMEA sanctioned festival during Spring Semester of 2025. CMEA sanctioned festivals include festivals hosted by CMEA Sections and also the Southern California Vocal Association (SCVA). Applications include a recording of the ensemble performing approximately 15 minutes of music with at least two works that best demonstrate the group's abilities. All recordings will be uploaded with the online application which will be emailed to all members in May and available on the CMEA website.

DATE & LOCATION

The California State Choral Festival, presented by World Projects, will be held on Friday, April 24, 2026 at the Green Music Center on the campus of Sonoma State University.

Your E-mail Address Matters SCVA

When you registered or renewed your annual SCVA Membership, you specified your work or personal e-mail address, both of which are unique to you. In some cases, you might have multiple e-mail address aliases for your school, but you must always standardize on the one that you used for your SCVA Membership.

When your students register to participate in an SCVA event, they should use the same e-mail address that you used when you created or renewed your Annual SCVA Membership. The system validates your e-mail address and verifies that your SCVA Membership Dues have been paid. Our systems will reject any student applications (such as Honor Choirs or Vocal Solo Competition) that don't use your primary e-mail address.

When that happens, the application is discarded and there is nothing that we can do to recover it. Instead, it is your responsibility to ensure that your singers use ONLY your primary e-mail address that is associated with your SCVA membership. In addition, when we have application deadlines, we cannot accept a claim that a student used the wrong e-mail address or if they had some Internet connectivity problems. It is as if they had not submitted any application at all. This is another great reason to teach your students that waiting until the last minute to submit their applications is not a very good idea.

On a related note, when your students use that primary email address for their audition applications, you can view all of the applications for your students by logging in to the Members-Only area of the website. You can also view all of your Festival Registrations on that page once we open the Festival Registration process.

Hints for using PayPal and How to Save Some Money

When using **PayPal** to pay the application or participation fees for multiple students, you can minimize the processing fees by adding the desired item to your Shopping Cart once, then specify a quantity for that one item. You should not add that item to your Shopping Cart mutiple times, since that will result in a larger processing fee being added to your total transaction amount.

Similarly, you can use a single PayPal transaction to pay the application fees, registration fees or participation fees for multiple events (such as multiple Festival Registration fees), rather than checking-out after every individual item. Simply add each item to the Shopping Cart, and then click on the "Continue Shopping" button to return to the SCVA website. After you have completed adding all of the items you wish to purchase, you can then proceed to the check-out page to complete the payment for everything, and you can receive a single invoice for all items you purchased.

MEMBERSpotlight

Tell us about your teaching career so far:

I am in my twelfth year as Vocal Music Director and AP Music Theory teacher at Troy HS in Fullerton. Previously, I served ten years at Segerstrom HS in Santa Ana, and thirteen years at Brea Olinda HS in Brea. Through the years I have also held adjunct positions at Fullerton College, Riverside College, and Mt. San Antonio College.

What is your history working with SCVA?

I have been an SCVA member since 1992, and have held many positions on the Executive Board including two terms as President.

What do you find yourself looking forward to every year?

The beginning of the school year is always a favorite time of year for me. I really enjoy the excitement of beginning the journey together, and the opportunity to see the dynamics of a group as the singers begin to bond and enjoy making music together.

Which piece have you most recently been excited about?

I love discovering a piece that is new to me and ends up becoming a favorite. "Parce Domine" by Feliks Nowowiejski is a beautiful piece with stunning harmonies and gorgeous dynamic contrasts. It contains an Anglican style choral chant section that is hauntingly beautiful and teaches several useful choral techniques. The singers absolutely loved rehearing and performing the piece.



MARK HENSON

What is a skill you now consider yourself accomplished in, that was not a strength when you began teaching?

I find that I tend to be much more "process oriented" now than I was when I began my teaching career. Reflecting on my first years, I focused too much on getting to the performance product, but have since then developed rehearsal and teaching techniques that serve the singers well and have also resulted in an improved result. I love being in the classroom!

What word of advice would you have for a brand new teacher this year?

If we offer singers quality instruction in a place where they feel safe and loved, they will flourish! I've had the privilege of teaching in schools with vastly different demographics and in each setting the students achieved a high level of musicianship and success. No matter the context, I have consistently found that students are drawn to the powerful community and artistic fulfillment that choral singing offers.
