

SPOTLIGHT •

RODGER GURRERO

Tell us about your teaching career so far.

This is year 40 as a choral director, 28 of which were spent conducting high school choral ensembles at Canyon HS (Canyon Country), Monache HS (Porterville, CA), and Harvard-Westlake School. I have also conducted K-8 choirs at San Gabriel Mission School & Holy Angels School in Arcadia. I also led a 4th-6th grade chorus at Westfield Elementary School in Porterville, CA (maybe my favorite chorus ever!). I conducted the USC University Chorus during my doctoral work there, as well as the Univ. of Miami Men's Chorus during my master's studies. Oh, and I led church choirs of multiple faiths for 30 years, on and off. This is my 10th year as Director of Choral Studies at Pasadena City College...I think that I still have a few years left in me.

What piece have you recently been most excited about?

There are too many to name! But along with my Central California buddies, Heather and Dan Bishop (Clovis), I led two sessions on Repertoire Selection at the CCDA Summer Conference this past July. I included a HUGE list of favorite choral works for the attendees at that conference, one that included about 200 octavos for SATB, SSAA, and TTBB voicings. Anyone who is interested in a copy of it can email me at PCC. Let's just say that it is incredibly diverse, both in terms of styles and historical eras.

What is one thing you wish you could tell your past self in his first year?

Time will fly, so stay in the moment. One day you're sweating over all of the details, the little things that don't really matter in the long run. The thing you know, it will be 40 years later, and all that matters are the wonderful relationships that you built with the incredible human beings you interacted with through choral music. Make your mark through the students you work with. That will be the mark that you make upon the world.

What is your history working with SCVA?

I led a choir at Canyon HS to my first-ever SCVA festival in 1986 at Crescenta Valley HS. I also hosted SCVA Festivals from 2002-2016 when I was at Harvard-Westlake School. Most importantly, my tenure on the SCVA Board started in the early 2000's, first as Vocal Solo Festival chair. Then I moved from assistant HS Honor Choir chair to HS Honor Choir chair, two terms as President (2010-2012 and 2014-2016) and finally as Past President for two terms after each of the presidencies. In short: I LOVE SCVA!!!

What piece of advice do you have for other choral professionals right now?

Hang in there. The music that our students create with and through us is the panacea for the pandemonium that surrounds us. Oh, and one more thing: the students that we work with are not "our students," and the ensembles that we lead are not "our choirs." We collaborate with the singers, but the choirs belong to them. WE belong to them.
