TTBB Choir Conductor: John K. Russell, DMA is the Director of Choral and Vocal Studies at Palomar College and the Music Director of the San Diego Master Chorale. In addition, he serves on the summer conducting faculty at Westminster Choir College in Princeton, New Jersey and is the Far South Regional Representative for the California Choral Director's Association.

Dr. Russell is also frequently in demand as a tenor soloist and was recently noted for his "heart-melting legato". His recent solo performances include Hector Berlioz's *Te Deum* with the San Diego Symphony, St. John Passion (Evangelist) with Pepperdine University, *Acis and Galatea* with the Bach Collegium San Diego and Monteverdi's *Vespers of 1610* with the Westminster Summer Choral Festival and Piffaro: The Renaissance Band in Philadelphia and Princeton.

Dr. Russell is a native of Kalamazoo, Michigan and is a graduate of Western Michigan University and Columbia University. He received his

Doctorate of Musical Arts in Choral Music from the University of Southern California. His primary conducting mentors are Craig Arnold, Joe Miller and Jo-Michael Scheibe and he has studied voice with William Appel, Curt Peterson, Jeanne Goffi-Fynn and Gary Glaze. He currently resides in San Diego with his wife, Jill and son, Parker.



SSAA Choir Conductor: Désirée La Vertu is the Director of Choral & Vocal Activities at Occidental College in Los Angeles. Previously, she was the director of the Glee Clubs at Caltech. She was on the voice faculties of Chapman University and the summer graduate program at CSU Los Angeles. As a soprano, Ms. La Vertu specializes in the oratorio repertoire, and has been a soloist in Poulenc's *Gloria* and Vaughan Williams' *Dona Nobis Pacem*, both at Disney Hall, Brahms' *Ein Deutches Requiem*, Handel's *Messiah*, Mozart's *Requiem*, and Bach's *Magnificat*. She is a member of the choral-vocal faculty of the

Idyllwild Arts Festival Choir and maintains a voice studio at her home in Pasadena.



SATB Choir Conductor: Dr. Trey Davis is Associate Director of Choral Studies at Louisiana State University. He is also the founder and conductor of Red Shift, a professional choir of exceptional vocal artists from throughout the nation. As recipient of the Julius Herford Dissertation Prize, he has presented at national and international conferences of the American Choral Directors Association and the College Music Society. Dr. Davis completed graduate studies in choral conducting at Texas Tech University and Westminster Choir College of Rider University. He holds a degree in music education from Pepperdine University.

Performance Guidelines - Quick Tips

- All registrations must have director approval.
- Directors or voice teachers must be current SCVA members.
- When performing in an ensemble, only one vocalist per part is allowed.
- Ensemble participants can have a group size of three to eight vocalists.
- All solo performances must be accompanied.
- All performers must supply their own accompanist.
- All solo performances must be memorized. Ensemble performances may choose to perform with scores.
- To be eligible for the Vocal Solo competition, students must perform a Classical, Musical Theatre, or Jazz standard solo. A selection from the 26 Italian Art Song book or equivalent is recommended.

Happy Fall, fellow Choir Directors! Jr. High Honor Choir auditions are right around the corner. Begin preparing your students now! A great way to do this is to incorporate one or two of the elements required for the audition in your warm-ups each day, (all elements are sung a cappella).

- Sing a major scale up and down
- Sing a major triad and a minor triad
- Sing an octave
- Sight read one melodic and one rhythmic example
- Sing tonal memory patterns
- Sing "America" / "My Country 'Tis of Thee" (first verse only)

Auditions are open to ALL students grades 6th – 9th, regardless of the school attended. Building these skills each day will give your students the tools to have a successful audition!

This festival will consist of 10-15 groups performing throughout the day. Each group performs 2-3 pieces on stage followed by an onstage learning clinic by our adjudicators. If groups opt for performing Vocal Jazz with accompaniment, instrumentalists can be provided for an additional cost. Up to 18 dynamic microphones are available for each group to use.

Each group will perform in a flight of 4 groups. Students will watch at least two groups before or after their warm up and performance/clinic while other schools watch in support. Though directors may choose to be scored privately or just adjudicated, this is a friendly learning festival and not a competition. SCVA Plaques will be awarded privately as Superior, Excellent, Good, Fair or participant if desired.



Show Choir camps can be a fun summer activity and field trip for your show choirs. There are many show choir camps in California, the Southeast US, as well as the Midwest. These can be a great resource for veteran teachers or new teachers to learn/review choreography and vocal techniques and to meet other show choir directors and choreographers from around the country.

When I was at North Kansas City High School in the 1980's and 1990's, we sent our new show choir students to Millikin University for a week during the summer. It was great fun! Teachers and students participated in show choir activities and workshops to develop and enhance our show choir programs.

Show Choir Camps of America, for instance, are well-supervised and structured environments. A typical day would include group choreography and vocal rehearsals, workshops led by well-known show choir guests, guest show choir performances, student teacher/staff talent showcases. Costs vary per camp but usually include housing, meals and a t-shirt.






Quick piano skills for your choral students

Teach students (especially new-musician students) how to play their starting notes and pitches on the piano. "There are two houses on the piano. The dog house, and the people house. In the little house is a dog. Trying to get in to the dog house is the cat (too small) and an elephant (too big). In the people house live George and Alice. The house has a front door and back door."

Teach them pitch through names stories:



I learned over time that these were the easiest ways for my students to learn chords and their notes on the scale in relation to playing them on the piano. I learned these concepts from students, other teachers, and from trial and error over a decade of how to get my students playing and singing the piano as *quickly* as possible. Want your choral students to become better singers? Get them playing piano. Begin by having students practice root triads in a fake book chart or chord charts of a song they want to sing. Remember to tell students the "root" of the chord is always 0. Count half steps from root to make each chord.
